G-33:

Knobloch Shooting Spectacles. One of highly specialized products from West Germany, these provide the shooter with the means of correcting most of the serious problems associated with sighting a pistol satisfactorily. The well made metal frame provides a fully adjustable occluder for the non sighting eye. Provision is also made for a lens to be fitted in a special frame contained on the same mounting as the iris. The inbuilt adjustments allow the shooter to look directly through the centre of the lens irrespective of the position of his head. Coloured lenses can of course be interchanged with the normal prescription clear lens.

Priced at approximately \$22.00 these glasses are a must for slow fire shooters with an optical problem.

G-34:

Lewis Lead Remover. Another product developed to assist the centre fire shooter comes from the U.S.A. It consists of a rod to which is fitted special attachments to enable lead to be readily removed from the barrel or cylinder of .38 cal. revolvers and autos. Replaceable bronze patches are used and cause no damage to the finish of the barrel etc. when used in accordance with the instructions. Price \$6.70.

G-35:

Guns smoke Sight Blackener. This miniature carbide lamp provides the best black yet seen by us. All that is required is a small piece of calcium carbide to be placed in the removable base, add a few drops of water, screw on the top and flick the flint wheel which ignites the gas. The difference a really black front sight makes has to be seen to be believed. Price \$5.50.

G-31:

Quite new on the market are the approved gauges manufactured by Stallard & Sitters Adelaide.

These gauges were recently approved by the A.P.S.U.A. and were used at the Thirteenth Nationals. They are manufactured from stainless steel, have alternative stems-spring or solid, and are supplied with a clear plastic pressure disc to obviate angular positioning, and to maintain a regular surface to the target area.

G-32:

The latest 'Standard Pistol' to reach the Australian market is the Beretta Model 76. This product from one of Europe's best known arms factories is aimed at the low to medium price field. Incorporated in this well made and durable pistol are features such as interchangeable front sight blades, fully adjustable rear sight mounted on a stable base, a lock to hold open the slide when the last shot has been fired, and an inbuilt weight well forward under the barrel. During testing the pistol functioned faultlessly on all popular ammunition. Recovery after recoil is very rapid. Trigger although considerably more than 2½ lbs. is crisp. A few hours spent by a competent man, lightening the pressure would improve the pistol's controllability dur-
